

CANCER FAMILY HISTORY QUESTIONNAIRE

Are you a candidate for genetic testing and counseling?

Did you know? About 5 – 10% of cancers may be due to gene mutations (changes) that can be passed down from generation to generation. People who inherit these mutations will have a higher risk of developing cancer during their lifetime. This is called a hereditary cancer syndrome.

Genetic counseling can help you understand your risk. A genetic counselor will look at your family history of cancer and your health history. If a hereditary cancer syndrome is identified, you'll discuss ways to reduce your risk with early detection and other preventative measures.

INSTRUCTIONS:

- For each row, please circle "Y" for "Yes" and "N" for "No." If you circle "Yes" for any question, indicate the family member's relationship to you, the site of their cancer and the age when they were diagnosed with that cancer.
As you fill out the questionnaire, include yourself plus your parents, siblings, children, grandparents, grandchildren, aunts, uncles, nephews, nieces, half-siblings, first-cousins, great-grandparents and great-grandchildren.
- If you answer "Yes" to any of the questions, please share this questionnaire with your family doctor.
- If you and your doctor believe you are a candidate for genetic testing and counseling, ask to be referred to ProMedica Cancer Institute's cancer genetics program. Our program is run by board-certified, licensed genetic counselors, and is the largest in the region.

SCHEDULING AN APPOINTMENT

One call to 419-824-8852 connects you to our cancer genetics scheduler. You'll be scheduled to visit one of our several locations in Ohio or Michigan.

- Our team will provide you with the codes for how the appointment will be billed to insurance. Self-pay rates are also available.

CANCER GENETICS PROGRAM

At your first appointment, a licensed genetic counselor will review your family and personal medical history. Then you'll discuss next steps. These may include genetic testing (blood tests), recommendations for starting cancer screenings at an earlier age or having them more often, and other ways to reduce your risks.

If genetic testing is needed, tests will be ordered. When results are back, the genetic counselor will review the results with you to provide additional guidance. A summary of your visit and medical management recommendations will be sent to your physician.
