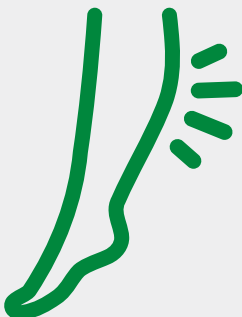

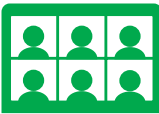
Improved Access

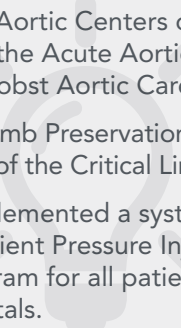
Community Engagement

Accreditations and Awards

Vascular Quality Initiative (VQI)

- Jobst participates in **10** procedure modules of the **Vascular Quality Initiative Registry (VQI)** sponsored by the Society of Vascular Surgery.
- In 2025, Jobst abstracted over **2,500** procedures for the VQI for initial and long-term follow-up.



Accreditations and Awards

- Jobst Vascular received the **3-star Participation award** from VQI for the **8th** year in a row.
- Jobst Vascular Laboratory's** clinical case poster won the Excellence Award at the National Conference, Nashville, Tennessee.
- Vein Care** was recognized by the IAC as having demonstrated an ongoing commitment to patient care by earning accreditation for a **third, consecutive three-year** accreditation cycle.



Education

Fellowship Program

- The Jobst Vascular Surgery Fellowship Program received **87** applications for the 2026 academic year and matched two candidates.
- The Jobst Vascular Medicine Fellowship Program welcomed two vascular medicine fellows: **Olubode Olufajo, MD**, venous and lymphatic fellowship, and **Ahmad Al-Sahli, MD**, vascular medicine and venous and lymphatic fellowships.

Learners

The vascular service line supported **216** residents, fellows, medical students, physician assistant students and pre-medical students on rotation with vascular surgery, vascular medicine and wound care. Sonography students from Owens Community College were also part of the group.
